Inclusion criteria:

- Menarchal patient*
- Pelvic sonogram performed

**Patients that have not yet undergone menarch can have torsion, however, it is rarer and less studied so should not follow this algorithm. Call Gynecology if you have a clinical concern.*

Exclusion criteria:


- Positive pregnancy test

Typical Clinical Features:

- Acute onset lower abdominal pain
- Often nausea/vomiting since symptom onset
- Lower abdominal tenderness
- Possible fever

Composite Adnexal Torsion Score for Menarchal Patients

Risk factor		Score
Vomiting since symptom onset	No	0
	Yes	2
Adnexal Volume (mL) (larger side)	< 75	0
	75 - 105	1
	> 105	2
Adnexal Ratio (mL or cc) Volume of the larger ovary/ volume of the smaller ovary	< 1.25	0
	1.25 - 21	1
	> 21	2



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
